## Featuring Special Panel Guests:

### DR MARY ROSE DAY

Dr. Mary Rose Day is Adjunct Senior Lecturer at the School of Nursing & Midwifery, University College Cork and currently works as an Independent Nurse Consultant specialising in Self-Neglect, Older Adults and Public Health Nursing. She has been the author of numerous publications on Self-Neglect and provided workshops to a range of professional groups in Ireland and the UK. She is a member of Sage Advocacy Policy and Practice committee and a committee member of the All-Ireland Gerontological Nurses Association.



### PROFESSOR MICHAEL PRESTON-SHOOT

Michael Preston-Shoot is Professor (Emeritus) Social Work at the University of Bedfordshire, England. He is a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences and a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. His publications, research and training have concentrated on law and social work practice. He has recently worked with Suzy Braye and David Orr researching major studies for the Department of Health in England on effective practice with adults who self-neglect. He is Independent Chair of Lewisham and Brent Safeguarding Adults Boards, and has authored several safeguarding adult reviews, as well as undertaking wider thematic research examining patterns and trends in adult safeguarding practice.



### DIANA HARRIS

Diana has worked as the Safeguarding Lead for the Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service for the last 20 years. Hoarding is a key challenge faced by Fire and Rescue officers, who frequently provide support to those at risk in this area. Diana has worked collaboratively with regional partners on the development of this procedure and policy to prevent harm to those at most risk.
